








We have enjoyed exploring these texts during assembly time and thinking about the story of Paddington bear - how he was lost and found and who helped him along the way!

Reception

Year R have had a fantastic first term at CKIS. We enjoyed sharing our treasure boxes and getting to know each other. Our Teddy Bear picnic was a success and we loved making our sandwiches!

Year 1

We have had a great start to Year 1! We have been using our indoor and outdoor environment to practise turn taking, collaborative working and consolidate our previous learning. We have immersed ourselves in nature and the changing of the seasons. We've used our senses to explore our surroundings and take notice of the calm provided in nature. The teachers are very proud of the children's fantastic writing at this early stage of the year.







Year 2

We have had a fantastic first term in Y2. We have learnt so much about the Great Fire of London already...just ask any of us and we will bombard you with facts!

We even made some bread with Mrs Walker.







In science, we have been testing materials to see if they are waterproof and even fireproof.

We have been doing some lovely writing about The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark and we are now reading The Queen's Hat by Steve Anthony.

Open the Book (OtB) is a national scheme which offers primary school children the opportunity to hear Bible stories. At CKIS, Alan Waller our Chair of Governors and the OtB team come in on a Wednesday morning for a full school assembly and will either tell a story using pictures or will act it out ... sometimes with the help of the children. As a result of the pandemic. we haven't been able to come into school in the last couple of years, but instead have made films that the children can watch. Now we are able to come in on a regular basis again. It's great fun and the children love it. Amongst other things, we are looking forward to making an earthquake by stamping our feet, making a rainstorm or knocking down Jericho (made out of cardboard boxes). PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING.

As the cost of living continues to rise, there may be families in our school community whose personal/financial circumstances have changed since their child/children started school in Reception.



All children at CKIS are entitled to **Universal Free School meals**.

In addition to this, as part of the **Pupil Premium Funding**, your children could be eligible to additional funding which includes free school meals post the age of 7.

Your child might be eligible if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

This benefits your family and your child/children in school. The **school receives funding** which is used to further enhance teaching and learning and improve outcomes for your child/ren and others across the school.

CUTLERY PRACTICE

Draw two sets of lines on a banana as above and select suitable cutlery



Turn the fork over and extend your pointing fingers.
