
NEWSLETTER



Dear families

It has been wonderful to see the first signs of Spring and we are hoping to see a lot more sunshine and warmth over the weeks ahead! It has been a busy term again at CKIS with lots of 'gold' standard learning.

This term we have been exploring our school theme of 'Respect and Tolerance' and have particularly enjoyed exploring these key texts:



We have been thinking about how we can show respect and tolerance to others by:

- Looking at someone.
- Listening to them.
- Making positive comments about things they say for example, 'I like your story about the dinosaurs'.
- Sharing and taking turns.
- Saying please and thank-you.
- Asking for permission please can I play with you?, please can I borrow your...?

We have also thought about ways that we can show tolerance and an understanding that others might have different views, opinions and needs. When we celebrate together as a whole school, we often use something that we call a 'marshmallow clap' as we know that some children don't like it in the hall when there is too much noise!

Our focus RESPECT learning characteristic this term has been 'Excellence' and we have been exploring how we can be more like Elliot Excellence by:

- Knowing what I am good at and celebrating this!
- Listening to others when they help me to think about ways in which I can improve as a learner and make my work 'gold standard'.
- Understand that sometimes I will find things tricky as a learner, but I will 'keep trying'.



Weekly 'Golden learner'




To highlight our RESPECT learning characteristics and to celebrate those children and pupils who are demonstrating their golden learning, we will be having a weekly class 'Golden learner'. Each week, these children's golden learning will be celebrated in our celebration assembly on a Friday afternoon and the children will be invited to have lunch with Mrs James on the golden table on a Monday lunchtime. We are all very excited about the golden table, including Mrs James!!

We are delighted to be part of the national 'CAS' – Creating Active Schools Project. As an active school our curriculum is informed by our key drivers, one of which is physical development. All children receive two high quality PE lessons a week (Real PE, Dance or



Gym) alongside many physical activities and opportunities across all areas of the curriculum. The children are continuing to enjoy completing their daily mile around the school track and we are lucky to have purchased new outdoor play equipment which the children are enjoying using at break and lunchtimes to encourage their active play. As part of the whole school project, we are continuing to explore additional opportunities for increased daily physical activity. Do keep an eye out for our travel to school survey next term to help inform the development of our whole school active travel plan.

Next term, we are delighted that our new library will be installed in Rainbow Room. The PFA are kindly supporting this and we are encouraging all children and families to get behind our 2023 challenge to help us to raise our target of £6,000 to complete this project.

PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING.

As the cost of living continues to rise, there may be families in our school community whose personal/financial circumstances have changed since their child/children started school in Reception.



All children at CKIS are entitled to Universal Free School meals.

In addition to this, as part of the **Pupil Premium Funding**, your children could be eligible to additional funding which includes free school meals post the age of 7.

Your child might be eligible if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

This benefits your family and your child/children in school. The **school receives funding** which is used to further enhance teaching and learning and improve outcomes for your child/ren and others across the school.
