

At Kindergarten we enjoy building positive relationships with our families. We strive to keep parents and carers informed and involved in all aspects of your child's learning and development. Throughout the year we offer the following opportunities to be involved in Kindergarten life:

Role of the Key Person

Every child who attends our Kindergarten will have a **Key Person**.

Your child's Key Person will help your child feel safe and cared for. The role involves responding sensitively to your child's needs, feelings and behaviours.

They will meet your child's emotional needs by giving reassurance, as well as supporting your child's well-being.



What do I need to bring?

- Fruit or vegetable snack (morning and afternoon) – in a named re-usable container
- Named water bottle
- Change of clothes
- Named coat, hat etc..
- Nappies/pull-ups
- Lunch (if having packed lunch)

Kids Club

We operate a before and after school club which is available to all children attending Charlton Kings Infants' School as well as Kindergarten. The club operates between 7.45am-8.50am and 3.00pm-5.30pm.

At breakfast club we serve a choice of cereals, pancakes, crumpets, bagels or toast with a choice of jam, honey or marmite. In addition, there are yoghurts on the table for the children to help themselves to and they have a choice of apple or orange juice, water or milk as a drink.

At after school club we have a selection of fruit each day and serve cheddar and/or rich tea biscuits, cheese, hummus, cucumber, sausages and pancakes, etc. We also offer seasonal food such as hot cross buns. The children are offered water to drink.
