Seesaw




We are a paperless school, and all school communication will be sent via Seesaw.

Class teachers regularly share pictures and videos from the week.


All communication from/to class teacher is handled through our secure 'Seesaw' learning journal.



Pupil premium – is your child entitled to Pupil Premium funding?



PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING




Could your child be eligible for Pupil Premium funding? This can provide your child with access to a range of additional opportunities to support their development and learning.

At Charlton Kings Infants' School we have high aspirations for every child. We believe that every child should be provided with a world class education that inspires them to reach their true potential. In order to ensure that every child thrives we endeavour to provide personalised learning opportunities based upon children's interests and their next steps for learning.

We recognise that some pupils are entitled to Pupil Premium funding and we use this money to ensure children access a wide range of opportunities in order to diminish the gaps between them and their peers. The money is spent on each child to ensure their individual and specific needs are met - this can be academic, social or emotional targeted support.

Eligibility for Pupil Premium grant:

- Children 'in care' (Fostered children)
- Children who have been adopted from care.
- Children from a 'Services' family.
- Children who are entitled to 'free school meals' (not universal free school meals). Families who are in receipt of one or more of the following are entitled to free school meals (Income support, Income-based jobseeker's allowance, Income-related employment and support allowance, support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, the guaranteed element of Pension Credit, Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190). Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit, Universal Credit.



Applying for Free School Meals: Parents/carers can register for free school meals by completing a short online form using the web address: http://www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/e ducation-and-learning/schooltransport-and-free-schoolmeals/apply-for-free-school-meals/ or by visiting the school office for a paper copy. The school administration team are happy to support parents to access the online application and telephone helpline where needed. Kids Club

We operate a before and after school club which is available to all children attendi Charlton Kings Infants' School as well as Kindergarten. The club operates between 7.45am-8.50am and 3.00pm-5.30pm.

At breakfast club we serve a choice of cereals, pancakes, crumpets, bagels or toast with a choice of jam, honey or marmite. In addition, there are yoghurts on the table for the children to help themselves to and they have a choice of apple or orange juice, water or milk as a drink.

Starting a new school?

Your child will be learning and playing with more children when they start their new school and could be at risk of catching preventable diseases if they haven't had all their childhood jabs.





If you are not sure if your child has had all their routine vaccinations, check their personal health record (Red Book) or contact the GP surgery. To get the best protection for your child, they need to have had two doses of MMR vaccine. For a checklest of the vaccines and the ages at which they should ideally be given visit:

Key Message

- Is your child ready for school? Are they up to date with their vaccination?
- Before they start school they should have had their 2nd Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) and their vaccination for diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough and polio (DTaP/IPV)
- Unsure? Check your child's vaccination status with your GP Surgery





Why is vaccination important?

- Protects our children against deadly diseases: measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, polio...
 - These diseases are rare because of our the success of our vaccination programme
- High rates of vaccination protect everyone: our children, older people, families, and our communities
 - Uptake of some vaccinations have declined in Gloucestershire. This has resulted in cases of measles, with some children admitted to hospital with serious complications.







- If unsure that your child is protected, check with their GP Surgery
- If your child is missing a vaccination, don't worry, arrange a catch up vaccination with the GP Surgery before your child starts school
