We also had a visit from the Life Education Van. We learnt all about our bodies and our feelings with Anita and Harold the Giraffe.




We are now very excited about our Christmas celebrations to come!

Parking

Important information about parking over drop-off and pick-up times

A reminder to all CKIS families to **always** park legally and considerately around the school.

We have received several complaints from our neighbours in recent weeks regarding driveways and pavements being obstructed by cars at drop-off and pick-up times. The school has been working with our Police Community Support Officers to try and resolve this, and the PCSO's will be present around the school during these busy times of day. **Fixed penalty notices** will be immediately issued to anyone who has parked illegally.

Remember that it is perfectly legal to park outside someone's house, unless the vehicle is **blocking a driveway**, or a **wheel is over a dropped kerb**. Parking on a pavement can obstruct and inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs, those with visual impairments, and people with prams and pushchairs.

CKIS families are invited to use the car park at the Charlton Kings Social Club at both drop-off and pick-up times, as well as the car park at The Royal at drop-off time in the morning.

PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING.

As the cost of living continues to rise, there may be families in our school community whose personal/financial circumstances have changed since their child/children started school in Reception.



All children at CKIS are entitled to **Universal Free School meals**.

In addition to this, as part of the **Pupil Premium Funding**, your children could be eligible to additional funding which includes free school meals post the age of 7.

Your child might be eligible if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

This benefits your family and your child/children in school. The **school receives funding** which is used to further enhance teaching and learning and improve outcomes for your child/ren and others across the school.

Reminder - Attendance and Holiday Absence in Term Time

Below are a few important items of information regarding your child's school attendance which we would be grateful if you could read.

<u>Understanding the importance of attendance at school:</u>

Please see the below table. It explains how an attendance of 90% actually equates to nearly 4 weeks away from school per academic year. The Department for Education classes such a level of attendance as 'persistently absent'

Attendance Percentages:

90% in a test is a good score; 90% attendance *isn't* – it's the same as having nearly 4 weeks off school a year! See the grid below for other percentages and see how much time off per year it adds up to:

Holiday absence

'no child may take holidays during term time, unless the Headteacher deems there to be exceptional circumstances. A penalty notice may be issued by the Local Authority if unauthorised holiday reaches a minimum of 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) during term time within the immediate preceding tenweek period.'

A timeline for managing persistent absence from school

A 'persistent absentee' is used to describe a child who only attends school for 90% or less of the time. At Charlton Kings Infants' School we aim to support you to help your child's attendance remain above the 90% threshold. The table below outlines what that support for parents and carers might look like across the academic year.

Further support for parent and carers:

The school is particularly keen to support parents or carers who may have a concern about their child's attendance. Please do not hesitate to contact the school office, requesting to speak to Mrs James and/or Mrs Pritchard (our Family Support Worker).
